The opportunity to house an unhoused family, the opportunity to ensure that individuals living with HIV and AIDS on Long Island are doing just that...living, and the opportunity to ensure that an individual has the supports needed to maintain their physical and mental health to their optimal level, as we all do.

I am proud and humbled by the work done at Options each day, and grateful for the opportunity to share our impact with you. On behalf of the over 2,000 adults and children served each year, the Board of Directors, our staff, and myself, I thank you for your kindness and support.



Care Coordination and Support Services

Adults received Options Coordination Services.

> **Children received Options** Medicaid-funded Care Coordination Services.

Adults were assisted through Ryan Whitefunded programs for those living with HIV/AIDS or at serious risk. Services include case management, insurance enrollment, health education. outreach and engagement.

Housing Stability and Homelessness Prevention

Individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS or who had a history of homelessness were housed in Options' ATC Permanent Housing Program.

Formerly homeless individuals/families were housed with the assistance of long-term rent subsidies.

Adults were provided Financial Assistance to secure housing or prevent eviction.

Formerly homeless individuals and families received temporary rent subsidies through the Rapid Rehousing program to secure stable housing.

Residential Services for Adults with Mental Illness

Adults resided in our affordable Supportive Housing for adults recovering from mental illness.

Adults recovering from serious mental illness were served through Options' NYS Office of Mental Health **Licensed Community** Residence program.

Adults with serious mental illness or substance use disorder received individualized Home and **Community Based Services** (HCBS) and Community Oriented Recovery and Empowerment (CORE) in their home or community empowering them to achieve personal goals.

Adults residing in mental health supportive housing in Suffolk County received enhanced services through the Options Mobile Residential Support Team.






Thank you for taking the time to review our Annual Report. This past year has been one of growth, impact, and renewed commitment at Options!

We proudly provided housing and supportive services to over 2,000 individuals and families living with disabilities, mental illness, and chronic health conditions. Key highlights from the year include:

- The addition of 12 new supportive housing units, expanding access to affordable housing in underserved communities.
- Strengthened partnerships with health and social service agencies, enhancing care coordination and wraparound support.
- Exceeding program outcome goals, reinforcing the success of our integrated care and housing model.
- Securing critical funding, including the CR-SRO Housing Grant, to support new construction of modern, high-quality housing.
- Continued emphasis on staff development, equitable hiring, and culturally responsive services as core organizational values.

Looking ahead, we are focused on:

- **Expanding our Young Adults Program** and behavioral health services, with a focus on trauma-informed care and telehealth.
- Launching a Data Platform to improve client tracking and outcomes.
- **Deepening staff recruitment and retention efforts** through training opportunities, wellness initiatives, and competitive rates and benefits.
- Strengthening community engagement to grow volunteer and donor support.

As an outcome of our strategic planning process, we established two new standing committees:

- The Partnership Committee—which will explore collaborations across housing, health, and social services, including potential agency acquisitions that align with our mission.
- The Advocacy Committee—focused on advancing affordable housing and mental health policy at the state and local levels.

It is an honor to serve as President of this dedicated Board. I extend my sincere gratitude to Yolanda Robano-Gross and the incredible team she leads. Their commitment and expertise are the driving force behind all that we accomplish.

WHERE WE HAVE BEEN

43 Years of Empowerment and Impact

Amid the deinstitutionalization movement, individuals with serious mental illness are discharged from state hospitals with few community-based services to support them. In response, Dr. Diana Antos Arens and Diane Mendolia, LCSW, incorporate Options for **Community Living to address** the urgent need for safe, affordable housing and accessible treatment.

The organization expands with the launch of its Mental Health **Supportive Apartment** Treatment Program, also certified by OMH.

1986

receives its first contract from the NYS Department of Health AIDS Institute to provide comprehensive case management through the Community Follow-Up Program. That same year, Options opens its first permanent supportive housing site and secures the first of what will become 16 HUD

Section 811 grants.

1994

With the HIV/AIDS epidemic

affecting Long Island, Options

Options completes its first supportive housing development for individuals living with HIV/AIDS. Over the next decade and a half, the agency completes numerous similar projects across Nassau and Suffolk Counties with the support of local, state, and federal partners.

1997

With support from the NYS Department of Health AIDS Institute, Options begins serving uninsured and underinsured individuals with HIV/AIDS.

2010

After decades of dedicated leadership, Dr. Arens retires. The **Board of Directors appoints** Yolanda Robano-Gross as the new Chief Executive Officer, ushering in a new era of leadership.

2014

To accommodate ongoing organizational growth, Options relocates its administrative offices to a larger space in Ronkonkoma.

2019

Options is awarded funding for a new OMH initiative: Enhanced Housing for Young Adults with Serious Mental Illness, expanding its services to meet the unique needs of this population.

Options opens its first two community residences, certified by the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH), laying the foundation for its residential mental health programs.

1991

The Options Thrift Shop opens in Lake Ronkonkoma, providing meaningful prevocational opportunities for individuals in residential programs and becoming a valued community fixture.

1996

To better serve its growing client base in Nassau County, Options opens a satellite office in Hempstead.

2000

Options earns accreditation with commendation from CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities), a designation it has proudly maintained for over two decades, reflecting its commitment to quality and continuous improvement

2012

New York State's Medicaid redesign brings about a significant shift: Options' case management services expand to include individuals with serious mental illness, HIV/AIDS, or multiple chronic health conditions. The agency becomes a Health Home care coordination provider in partnership with Northwell Health and Sun River Health.

2017


Two new NYS OMH contracts add 85 supportive housing beds and enable program expansion into Nassau County. Options also launches care coordination services for children and opens a new satellite office in Amityville.

2023

Through the Empire State **Supportive Housing Initiative** (ESSHI), Options launches 10 new supportive housing units as part of the Smith Street development in Freeport, continuing its commitment to housing as a foundation for recovery and stability.
